Waleed Hazbun is Richard L. Chambers Professor of Middle Eastern Studies in the Department of Political Science at the University of Alabama.

After earning a PhD at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology he taught international relations at Johns Hopkins University and the American University of Beirut (AUB). A scholar of international tourism, Middle East geopolitics, and US foreign policy, he is author of *Beaches, Ruins, Resorts: The Politics of Tourism in the Arab World* (Minnesota, 2008), co-editor of *New Conflict Dynamics: Between Regional Autonomy and Intervention in the Middle East and North Africa* (Copenhagen, 2017), and a founding member of the Critical Security Studies in the Arab World working project supported by the Beirut-based Arab Council for the Social Sciences (ACSS). His ongoing research addresses the politics of insecurity and US policy in the Eastern Mediterranean. Professor Hazbun is currently a visiting professor at the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki. The lecture will take place in the context of the course "Special topics in international relations", School of Political Sciences, Aristotle University of Thessaloniki.
